So Proud of Year 6

Congratulations to all the Year 6 boys and girls at the Juniors. This week the boys and girls participated in the first SATs since 2019. It was an intense week for them all as they focused and worked hard on their spelling, punctuation and grammar papers, their reading paper and their 3 mathematics papers. And, it doesn't stop there! The children's next task will be to produce a lot of writing examples which will be moderated and a judgement made on the quality of their writing. On Tuesday 5th July, they will find out how well they have done.

What makes these particular children's achievements more remarkable is that they are the first cohort to do SATs post lockdown. The test papers have made no allowances for the time the children have missed large chunks of their schooling. Since March 24th 2020 until last week, all the Year 6 children have missed in excess of 25% of their 'normal' schooling and even more when we take into consideration individual and family self-isolation periods. So, for the children to demonstrate such conscientiousness this week has been quite inspiring and that is why we are all so proud of them. We would also like to say a huge thanks to all our parents/carers who supported the children so well during this week and in the run up to these SATs.

Behind every cohort of good children is an army of passionate and expert teachers and support staff. Without these colleagues the children's life chances would be lessened. Therefore, gargantuan thanks to Miss Duffy, Mrs Whitfield and all current staff and past staff who have contributed to enabling our Year 6 children to successfully navigate their way through this week.

Reception have been invaded by...6 furry chicks this week. The children think they are awesome as they flutter around in their cage. The children have seen the chicks arrive as eggs firstly and then hatch into beautiful, fluffy baby chicks so they have see NEW LIFE emerging before their very eyes. Year 2 next week will be 'showing off' their reading and mathematics skills as they begin their key stage 1end of key stage assessments. We wish them all to do their very best.

Safeguarding is always at the top of our priorities.
