








## Sharing the Gospel


### A step into the unknown

We all have a voice and our opinions should be heard. If we want to help care for and protect natural habitats, we can use our voice and take action.

The story it links to in the news is:

It has been suggested that the number of hazel dormice in the UK has dropped from around 3.5 million to only 750,000 in almost 30 years. Currently, their conservation status is classed

as 'vulnerable', but some researchers say people should be more worried for them. A recent report from the University of Exeter urges for hazel dormice to be reclassified as 'endangered' and calls for more conservation action.
