

Schools in parts of Turkey and Syria have been reopening in the weeks since the devastating earthquakes hit many in the thrm of makeshift tents. Teachers in the affected areas are making certain children's education continues, despite the difficult circumstances. Many school buildings were affected in

the earthquakes at the start of February, leading to all educational institutions nationwide being closed for over two weeks. Although many learning centres have since reopened, lessons have had to also continue in tent schools, setup by volunteers and authorities in the worst affected areas.
